Description:

Accounting 3 is the third and final curriculum year. Accounting 3 provides students with a more in depth look at accounting related issues such as uncollectible accounts, depreciation, inventory, notes and interest. It culminates into Chapter 22 which encompasses all fiscal year end work. This involves a more complex work sheet involving adjustments and federal income tax calculations, financial statements including the Statement of Stockholders Equity, as well as adjusting, closing and reversing entries. As the senior prepare to graduate we complete a unit on personal finance topics such as budgeting, investing, savings, as well as topics like career prep and resume building. The course concludes with the remaining juniors finishing up the book covering topics like partnership accounting and international and internet sales.

Learning Experiences:

Students will experience learning through many formats in addition to routine classroom experiences including a hands on simulation for the honors level. The variety of technology utilized includes the use of the ENO Board in conjunction with software programs such as Easiteach and Excel.
