Level 4 Honors – Documentary TV and Film Track Overview

Description

The purpose of this course is to develop advanced skills in the production of documentary television and creative filmmaking. Students will develop skills in both studio and field production, with a focus on producing programming for broadcast on the Norwood Public Access television station. Honors students will be expected to have a leadership role within the class and participate in extracurricular activities on a regular basis.

Learning Experiences

- Students will supervise and direct advanced studio productions including cameras, control room best practices, audio, microphones and advanced lighting techniques.
- Students will use hands-on experiences to practice and supervise advanced studio productions in a cooperative team environment.
- Students will supervise, practice and direct on-camera performances such as hosting, anchoring and sports reporting.
- Students will supervise and practice the communication skills, both verbal and non-verbal, used in the studio environment.
- Students will write, produce, direct and edit honors-level television news packages and creative short films.
- Students will train underclassmen on the equipment involved in Studio Production, Electronic Field Production and Electronic News Gathering, such as camcorders, microphones and computer-based editing systems.
- Students will contribute feature-based content to *Mustang Magazine* and *NHS After Dark,* which will be broadcast to the Norwood community via NPA-TV.
- Students will work with professionals from the Norwood Public Access Television station on various projects broadcast via NPA-TV.
- Students will enter work and participate in regional, state and national broadcast competitions.
