# **Course Registration for Grades 9-11**







It is hard to believe, it is time to start thinking about courses for next year! We are excited to kick off Course Registration for the 2024-2025 school year! You all have worked hard this year and we are so hopeful that next year will be even better. Everyone has received an email from Mrs. Derrane with instructions on how to register for courses in Aspen. After vacation, from February 26th- March 1st , school counselors will meet with all students to review their requests and make any necessary changes or adjustments. We are excited to see what you have selected!

### Seniors:

Please be aware that we sent the "Mid-year report" to all of the colleges/universities to which you have applied.

For those students who applied to college, please let us know about those decisions that you receive. We are happy to talk through any decisions you need to make. And be sure to complete the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)</u> to see if you qualify for financial aid to help pay for your college tuition and expenses. Please note that this year there will be a delay in the colleges/universities receiving the FAFSA information from the government. As a result, *some* schools have delayed their deposit date (May 1st). Be sure to check with your individual schools regarding their financial aid timeline.

If you still need to apply to 2 and 4 year colleges or you need help with other post-graduation plans including military, technical/trade schools and/or employment, please let us know. We are happy to help you.


# Library Nook
