


are exhibiting at High Art May 16-June 1 at the Attleboro Arts Museum, 86 Park St, Attleboro.

Norwood Fine Arts Festival and National Art Honor Society

- On Friday, April 28th, he National Art Honor Society inducted its new members with a ceremony and a special preview of the artwork for the Fine Arts Festival. We inducted 25 new members!
- On Saturday, April 29th from 10:00am-2:00pm, we had our 24th annual Fine Arts Festival, which celebrates the artistic accomplishments of Norwood Public School students from Kindergarten through 12th grade.

The Festival originally started years ago as artwork in store front windows in downtown Norwood and has grown to an art exhibition with over 700 pieces of artwork from the Willett, Balch, Callahan, Cleveland, Oldham, Prescott, Coakley Middle School and Norwood High Schools. There are both 2D and 3D artworks made from a wide variety of art materials and techniques. Our AP Art and Design students work in pairs to curate their own artwork. It is the only time the district comes together K through 12 to celebrate student work. As part of the Fine Arts Festival, band, orchestra, chorus, and drama performances were given, along with TV and media presentations. During the awards ceremony, an award was given to former fine arts director, Catherine Connor-Moen for Fine Arts advocate.

Student unsung hero awards were given to Audrey and Keira Haberlin for art, Maria Boabosa for band, Sathvika Kommera for orchestra, Rebecca Alliance and Maura Beades for chorus, John Cavanaugh for TV-Media arts, Margaret Stenstrom for Drama, and Sheridan Wynne for art, drama and music.

The Festival was well-attended by families as they came together with teachers and administrators to celebrate the amazing work happening in the Fine Arts classes in Norwood Public Schools.

Go to Settings > Accessibility > Audio/Visual > Scroll down to "Headphone Notifications"

Meanwhile **do not park** in the visitor lot.


NEMMY Awards
